<b>Early Head Start (Home based)</b>
Free home based family education program helps parents support their children's learning at home.
<b>Who is eligible?</b> Low income families with children birth to age 3, pregnant mothers, expectant fathers.

<b>Educare Early Learning Center</b>
Full day Early Head Start and Head Start classrooms with wrap around childcare.
<b>Who is eligible?</b> Low income families who are working full time and need full day childcare. Working Connections Childcare Subsidy or City of Seattle Childcare Subsidy accepted, co-pay may be charged. (\$)

<b>Head Start and ECEAP Classrooms (WC Locations: HS at Greenbridge, Seola Gardens, White Center Heights Elementary, And Hilltop Elementary. ECEAP at Valley View.</b>
Free part day (3.5 hours) comprehensive preschool classrooms with health, nutrition and family support.
<b>Who is eligible?</b> Children who are 3 or 4 years old by August 31 of the current program year. Eligibility to enroll is based on income and applications are prioritized by need.
